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Fundació Catalunya Voluntària - FCV is the testimony of **Barcelona Voluntària**, a non-profit organisation that was founded in 1999 by three young Catalans. Since September 1999, the **Barcelona Voluntària Association** has been involved in various projects and has accumulated considerable experience, leading it to occupy an important place among the organisations working in the international youth field. **On 25 October 2007, the Barcelona Voluntària Association became the Fundació Catalunya Voluntària**, continuing with the same spirit and philosophy, being an instrument of civic and social training.

FCV is defined as a space for training and non-formal education and a project promoter, whose objective is to offer people of all ages the opportunity to develop their skills through their active participation in educational and social actions, with a positive impact on their communities.

Since its beginnings, and throughout its history, FCV has always carried out programmes and actions so that young people who so wish can find it easy to participate in voluntary actions, promoting volunteering that is understood as a supportive, inclusive and participatory experience, and that should respond to their interests and abilities.

For this reason, it promotes voluntary actions focused on results and with the capacity to offer real learning and empowerment opportunities to young volunteers, incorporating their skills and talents.

MISSION

To promote active volunteering, non-formal education and the culture of peace, in order to make positive social change possible, in Catalonia and throughout the world.

VISION

To build a world where everyone, especially young people, have the will and the capacities to take action with a positive impact on their communities, as citizens in a globalised world.

FCV actively promotes **volunteering and non-formal education** as tools to improve society, as opportunities to develop **key competences** and as means to become more active, autonomous and responsible citizens. It offers **information, support and training**, organises campaigns, conferences, workshops and promotes innovative initiatives focused on the promotion and social recognition of volunteering, **the Culture of Peace, non-formal education and intercultural learning**. It also collaborates actively with other non-profit organisations, networks, individuals and institutions at local, regional and international level.

FCV focuses on **young people** who are vulnerable or have fewer opportunities. FCV operates mainly within the framework of 3 programmes:

Catalans in the World: facilitates the participation of young people between 18 and 35 years of age in international training and mobility programmes. FCV is the coordinator and promoter of European Voluntary Service projects, training and youth exchanges throughout the year in Catalonia, countries of the European Union, regions of Eastern and South-Eastern Europe, as well as the Mediterranean.

Call for Peace: promotes the participation of young people in awareness-raising and training actions dedicated to peace building, non-violent communication and conflict transformation, and carries out international networking projects. Programme aimed especially at workers, students and leaders of organisations, motivated to learn and reflect on peace education and human rights.

Active Volunteering: promotes that all young people can be active volunteers, a concept understood as an experience of civic, educational, inclusive and participative volunteering. It offers training to other local non-profit organisations in educational volunteering.

FCV is a member of the Coordinadora de Entitats del Poble Sec, the Barcelona Youth Council -CJB, the BCN Antirumors Network, the Catalan Federation of Social Volunteers -FCVS, the Spanish network Anna Lindh Foundation for Intercultural Dialogue - ALF, the United Network of Young Peacebuilders - UNOY, the UNITED for Intercultural Action and the International Association for Volunteer Effort -IAVE.

This programme offers the necessary support for young people to participate in **volunteer, training and exchange programmes abroad**, to develop useful competences, skills and attitudes, both personally and professionally, prioritising the participation of young people with fewer opportunities, as well as those responsible for other Catalan organisations.

It has the support of Obra Social "la Caixa" to facilitate young people referred by member organisations of the Incorpora network, who are at risk of social exclusion, to be its priority beneficiaries.

FCV coordinates and promotes volunteering activities, courses, seminars, youth exchanges, visits, meetings and events within the framework of the European Commission's **'European Solidarity Corps' and 'Erasmus+'** programmes, in close collaboration with other non-profit and non-governmental organisations from all over Europe and the world.

Since 2014, FCV has been developing the **"Move to Learn!"** project to ensure the participation of young people living in Barcelona and Catalonia in international mobility programmes, with the support of Barcelona City Council, the Generalitat de Catalunya and Obra Social "la Caixa", making it possible for young people at risk of social exclusion to participate in all the activities.

MOVE TO LEARN: INTERNATIONAL MOBILITY FOR YOUTH

In the year 2022, the **"Move to Learn!"** project has developed normally, taking into account that the previous years 2020 and 2021 were particularly hard due to the effects of the Covid19 pandemic.

The **"Move to Learn!"** project includes different activities; among them we can highlight the Youth Exchanges and the International Trainings, which are the type of projects in which FCV has the highest volume of participation.

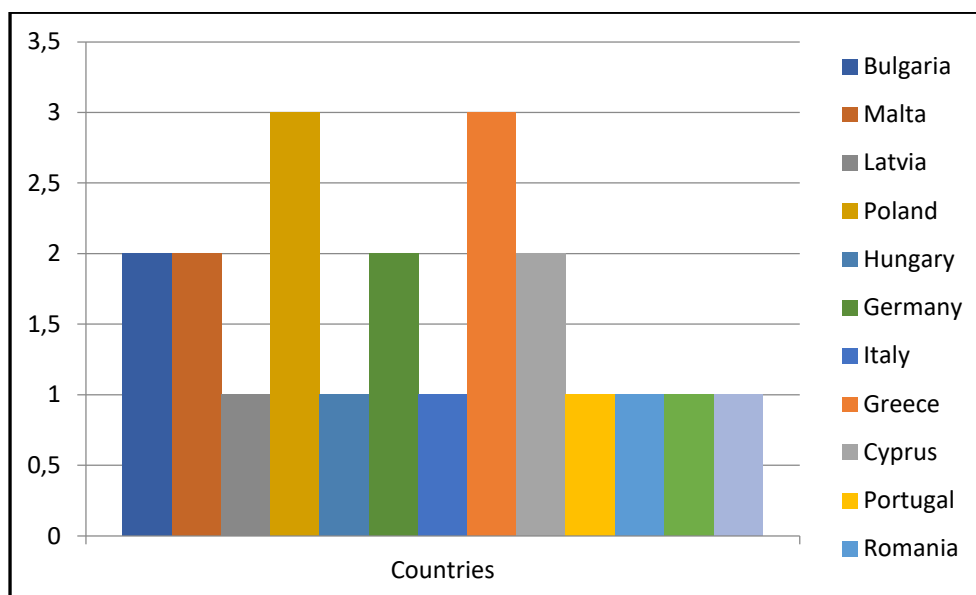


Throughout the year 2022, **21 short-term projects** have been participated in, of which 10 were youth exchanges and 11 international trainings. However, a total of **75 young people have had the opportunity to participate and be enriched by the experience.**

On the other hand, during 2022 a total of **111** applications were received through the participation form that we have integrated into the Catalunya Voluntària Foundation's website. Of all the applications, in addition to people referred from various training centres, associations and foundations (AEMA, Fundació Esperança and CECACC).

The destinations of the short-term projects were very varied: Bulgaria, Malta, Latvia, Poland, Hungary, Germany, Italy, Greece, Cyprus, Portugal, Romania, Georgia and Austria (13 different countries).

The cities of residence of the participants from all over Catalonia: Vilanova i la Geltrú, Manresa, Terrassa, Sabadell, Tossa de Mar, Torroella de Montgrí, Solsona, Santa Cristina de Aro, Vic, Igualada, Tarragona, Balaguer, Tremp, Berga, Cervera, Hospitalet de Llobregat, San Juan Despí, Pineda de Mar, among others.

During 2022, FCV has been able to reactivate the **TLN Mobilicat**, a programme promoted and co-financed by the Catalan Employment Service (SOC) and the European Social Fund, with the **aim of offering professional internships to young people registered in the Youth Guarantee**.

Specifically, FCV, with the project '**Expanding Horizons: Work Internships in Europe**', involved a total of 23 young people, aged between 18 and 29, with very diverse professional profiles. The project has achieved the objectives set, as all the participants met the profile and characteristics required by the programme. The project has contributed to more young people being able to enjoy an internship experience in another European country, offering the necessary resources and structure to guarantee the success of the project.

Of the 23 young people, 7 returned to resume their studies, 8 found jobs and 8 are in the process of research (August 2022).

In addition, it is worth highlighting the presentation of the TLN Mobilicat project for the 2022-2023 call, which was approved in December to be implemented during 2023.

LONG TERM PROJECTS – KA2

PROJECTS COORDINATED BY FCV

In 2022 FCV **has managed and coordinated two long-term KA2 projects for youth exchange and cooperation and for the creation of new quality intellectual products**, hosting the two main training actions and coordinating the work of the partners from Italy (Human Rights Youth Organization and Associazione Informa Giovani), Portugal (Amarante Marao Clube), Greece (United Societies of Balkans) and Hungary (Efficient Youth Organization-EKE).



KA2 'MAINSTREAMING MEDIA LITERACY AND THINKING COMPETENCES IN YOUTH WORK'

FCV has managed the work of the various local and international teams to carry out the set of activities planned (managers, experts, youth workers and technical support for the dissemination of activities), at the local level, **with the implementation of local activities in the 5 cities where the 5 partner organisations of the 5 participating countries are located, and at the international level, highlighting the organisation of the international training course 'MMLTC'**, which took place in Vilanova i la Geltrú (Barcelona) from the 16th to the 21st of February, with the participation of 18 youth workers and project managers, including the maximum leaders of 3 of the 4 partner entities, as well as the international meeting of the project, which took place in Amarante (Portugal), in the House of Culture and Youth, from the 17th to the 20th of July, with the participation of the team of experts, composed of 9 people.

The implementation of the project includes the creation of new information materials, dissemination and promotion of activities (publication of news, posts, stories, reels and short videos), as well as the research, collection and creation of materials and teaching resources (games, workshops, presentations), which will be part of the manual.

KA2 'FINE ARTS FOR FINE LEARNING'

FCV has managed the work of the various local and international teams to carry out the set of activities planned (managers, experts, technical support for the dissemination of activities and the creation of the project website), at the local level, with the implementation of local activities in the 5 cities where the 5 partner **organisations from the 5 participating countries have their headquarters, and at the international level, The international workshop 'Fine Arts for FINE Learning', which took place in Vilanova i la Geltrú (Barcelona) from 25 to 31 March, with the participation of 28 people, most of them young people with fewer opportunities**, as well as the international meeting of the project, which took place in Budapest (Hungary), at the headquarters of EKE from 4 to 6 November, with the participation of the international team of experts, those responsible for the publication and the coordinator of the project.



The realisation of the project includes the creation of a new innovative methodological concept, the creation of new information, dissemination and promotion materials for the activities (publication of news, posts, stories, reels and short videos); the research, compilation and creation of new pedagogical materials and resources (games, workshops, presentations), which will be part of the manual, and the creation of a website www.fineartsforfinelearning.org

KA2 'ECORASMUS – SUSTAINABLE AND ECO-FRIENDLY PRACTICES IN EDUCATIONAL YOUTH WORK'

ERASMUS+ VOCATIONAL, EDUCATIONAL AND TRAINING – VET. SENDING

During the year 2022 FCV has collaborated with different **vocational training centres in Catalonia to support them in the organisation of Erasmus+** mobilities so that students of intermediate and higher education can carry out a work placement in another European country.

The support tasks include the accompaniment of the centre in all parts of the mobility process, from the search for the destination, place of work placement, administrative support, etc.

Specifically, we have established collaborations with INS Joaquim Mir and INS Sa Palomera. We have facilitated the mobility of 36 young people, between Italy, Portugal and Bulgaria.

The mobilities have been divided as follows:

INS Joaquim Mir (Vilanova i la Geltrú)

- 10 Intermediate students bound for Portugal.
- 5 students of Intermediate Degree with destination Italy.
- 4 students of Higher Level with destination Bulgaria.
- 5 students of Higher Grade bound for Portugal.

ERASMUS+ VOCATIONAL, EDUCATIONAL AND TRAINING – VET. HOSTING

In 2022 **FCV welcomed 3 groups of students from 3 different schools (50 students in total)** who got to know the sector they are studying by doing internships in different spaces, schools, companies and non-profit organisations, participating in a programme created by FCV, where internships are complementary to non-regulated activities of exchange, teamwork and reflection in groups, as well as visits.

All three activities have achieved their social and learning objectives without exception. The schools have expressed their satisfaction and interest in continuing to collaborate with FCV. The activities have been carried out with the support of the Bulgarian NA and the Erasmus+ programme and in partnership with the European Initiative Centre Stara Zagora.

ESC SENDING

During 2022 FCV has facilitated the participation of 35 young people in the European Solidarity Corps (ESC) volunteering programme.

FCV has supported 3 stages of each volunteering project:

Pre-departure preparation stage: includes selecting the programme to participate in, preparing application documents such as CV and motivation letter, and preparing individual pre-departure training. This individual training covers topics such as culture shock, ESC project advice, rights and obligations, etc.

Support stage during the international volunteering stay: includes online meetings, problem management and reflection days.

Follow-up Stage which includes an individual meeting to evaluate the programme, avoid 'culture shock' upon return and support in planning the next steps after the mobility.

The participants of the ESC have been young people between 19 and 29 years old. The ESC has involved 35 volunteers in total: 21 women and 14 men. They have participated in projects in 10 different countries: France, Greece, Portugal, Finland, Hungary, Romania, Poland, Slovakia, Germany and Italy.

The projects have lasted between 2 and 12 months and 33 out of 35 participants have managed to complete the whole project without shortening their stay.



The projects have taken place in different non-profit organisations and the volunteers have been involved in different tasks such as working with children, language teaching, project design, social network management and supporting cultural events.

The European Solidarity Corps' volunteer programmes have mainly had an impact on participants' learning. This fact has been highlighted notably during the evaluation sessions after the end of the volunteering project. Many participants mention that their career path seems clearer after the project and that their feeling of European citizenship has increased. All of them expressed the improvement of their English and most of them also highlighted the learning of the local language of the host country.

HOSTING VOLUNTEERS

In 2022 FCV has hosted 4 volunteers and trainees in the framework of the European Solidarity Corps and the French Civil Service. Participants in 2022 have come from Poland, Russia and France.

The volunteering programme provided by FCV has **had a positive impact on the participants'** sense of entrepreneurship, future job prospects, European citizenship and language skills.

The four volunteers have volunteered at the FCV office developing responsibilities in the areas of communication and project management.

Theo and Zaklina have decided to link their professional life with youth work after the experience at FCV. Lara has decided to continue education in the field of graphic design after the internship at FCV.

In 2022 FCV participated in an ESC project coordinated by CEV- European Volunteer Centre 'Single Use Plastic Awareness, Stop All Plastic Straws'.

A group of 13 young activists from Italy, Germany, Cyprus and Catalonia volunteered in Barcelona for 2 weeks in July, carrying out awareness and advocacy actions.

CALL FOR PEACE

This programme is especially aimed at workers, students and leaders of associations who are motivated to learn and reflect on peace education and human rights.

FCV enables young people to **participate in awareness-raising and training activities dedicated to peace building and conflict transformation** and carries out strategic networking projects at international level in the field of peace and disarmament, human rights education, non-violence, intercultural dialogue and democratic participation.

Its objectives include the creation of new information and training resources to incorporate key competences for peace building (such as non-violent communication, conflict transformation, critical reading of the media) in teachers and students, against bullying, violence and discrimination, for a culture of peace in schools.

The project is supported by the Erasmus+ programme of the European Commission, the Barcelona Provincial Council and the Anna Lindh Foundation for Intercultural Dialogue.

ACCOMPANIMENT FOR REFUGEE PERSONS

Between 2007 and 2014, when the conflict in Ukraine began, we maintained a training collaboration project with the Higher Institute of Tourism Business in the city of Donetsk, which ended when this city became the centre of the conflict. When this new phase took place, we found that people who had participated in the programme or family members were coming as refugees, as well as other people who had already come and we offered them help, especially in personal accompaniment and administrative

procedures and, in some cases, in the search for accommodation, work and the contribution of specific economic resources. Nine people have benefited.

The governing body of the Fundació Catalunya Voluntària is made up of people from different professional backgrounds who are **committed to the mission of the organisation** and who make the development of the different projects possible.
